During my recent trip to Sweden I decided to read the book *To End All Wars* by Ernest Gordon. After having seen the movie a number of times throughout the years, I wanted to find out more details about the lives and the story. The movie is excellent and I thought I knew what I was getting myself into, but I was sorely mistaken. The book deeply shook my foundations and finishing it somewhere over Greenland, I was left speechless.

The book tells the story of how Ernest was captured by the Japanese during the fall of the Philippines in 1942 and the ordeals he and the other allied POW's went through building the railway by the River Kwai in Thailand. There in the midst of despair, pain and suffering, while longing to die, Earnest makes an unlikely encounter – he finds Jesus. The result is an amazingly beautiful display of the love of Jesus, slowly changing the death camp from being hell on earth to the footstool of the Almighty, in a place where no hope should exist, life sprouts up like a flower, and prisoner after prisoner is transformed!

The Kingdom of God is an upside-down kingdom, but it is so easy to forget that. Jesus says that the first shall be the last, that we have to die to live, that we are not to be served but to serve...

Walking away from reading that book, I was left with the challenge as to the driving force in my life - is it to be served, or to serve? What are my priorities? Is the love of Christ really the focus in my life? Am I really living an upside-down life? God's desire is for His life to go forth wherever we go. Let's be a people who make serving our passion!
